Kaskaskia, plaintiff, demands restitution of a negro and negress from defendant Jean Bte. Huberdeau, trader of Kaskaskia. In his note of Feb. 30, 1763, defendant promises to deliver to plaintiff a negro and a negress in exchange for a negress and 3 (ms. damaged). Plaintiff later gave Labusiere power of attorney to collect the debt from Huberdeau at New Orleans, at which time, defendant gave Labusiere 1 male negro slave, without telling him the slave was partially blind. Testimony of surgeon Roy concerning a mysterious epidemic. The disease is fatal and seems to have been brought to this area by the soldiers in Capt. George's Company, upon 4 or 5 of whom he performed autopsies. He is of the opinion that the diseases are due to natural causes, such as changes in climate and food, and not to poison. Cerre.
